MMR & link to autism - Myths about the MMR vaccine and autism. Included is a comprehensive list of studies and their findings.

There is no evidence of any link between the MMR vaccine & autism. Autism is a developmental disorder which is usually diagnosed in pre-school children. The original research which suggested a link has now been discredited.

The National Autistic Society have issued a statement saying that 'there is no link between autism and the MMR vaccine <u>The causes of autism</u>
